

May 28, 2020

The regular meeting of the County Commissioners of Allegany County was held in the Commissioners' Meeting Room, Allegany Room 100, 701 Kelly Road, Cumberland, at 5:00 p.m. on the above date. The following were present: Commissioner Jacob C. Shade; Commissioner Creade V. Brodie, Jr.; Commissioner David J. Caporale; County Administrator (outgoing) Brandon S. Butler; Interim (to be appointed this evening) County Administrator Jason Bennett; and County Attorney T. Lee Beeman, Jr. The following business was transacted:

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present at this meeting.

MOTION

There were no additions or deletions to the Agenda.

MOTION

Upon Motion by Commissioner Brodie, seconded by Commissioner Caporale, and Motion carried, the Commissioners approved the Minutes of the May 7, 2020, public business meeting.

PUBLIC HEARING

Item 1 – Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Hearings – The Allegany County Commissioners will obtain the views of citizens on community development, economic development, and housing needs, and offer citizens the opportunity to review the application for funds awarded through the federal CARES Act for coronavirus prevention, preparation, and response in Allegany County – David K. Nedved, Economic & Community Development Representative, thanked the Commissioners for setting the CDBG Public Hearings for this evening, and he informed them that he has received no comments on the draft application for CDBG funding. He explained that holding a public hearing is a requirement for the application, to provide an opportunity for anyone interested to present ideas for economic development, community development, and housing needs, and also for virus prevention, preparation, and response.

Mr. Nedved reported that special CDBG funding would be available through the CARES Program because of the COVID-19 pandemic, for uses such as senior services, food programs, homeless assistance, rental assistance, rural health centers, services for disabled adults, and other essential services. He explained that the County would make application for the funds on behalf of Allegany County HRDC.

Next, Mr. Nedved confirmed that the appropriate notice was advertised in the local newspaper, and he added that five pages of background information regarding the application and funding would be available on the County's website.

The draft application was available for the public to review and to provide comments on Tuesday, May 26, 2020, until Monday, June 1, 2020, during normal business hours at the Allegany County Department of Economic and Community Development, 701 Kelly Road, Suite 400, Cumberland, Maryland, by appointment, or by e-mail, contacting David Nedved at 240-727-2787 or at dnedved@alleganygov.org.

Commissioner Brodie expressed his gratitude to CDBG and to Cindy Stone and her group, remarking on their importance to Allegany County and commenting on how great it is to work with them. Commissioner Brodie also thanked Mr. Nedved for his efforts regarding the CDBG program.

Commissioner Shade opened the Public Hearing. No additional comments were received, and the hearing was officially closed.

At this point in the meeting, before proceeding with the Action Agenda, Commissioner Shade called forward Mr. Brandon Butler, outgoing County Administrator, and the Commissioners presented him with a small gift in appreciation.

ACTION AGENDA

SETTING THE LEVY – Budget Actions for Fiscal Year 2021

Item 2 – Budget Message – The Board of County Commissioners' Budget Message: President Jacob C. Shade read into the record the Fiscal Year 2021 Budget Message, a copy of which is attached to and made a part of these Minutes.

Item 3 – Resolution 20-5 – Enact Resolution 20-5 adopting the Fiscal Year 2021 Operating and Capital Budget in the amount of \$141,815,560 – Jason M. Bennett, CPA, Director of Finance,

briefly reviewed the Fiscal Year 2021 Operating and Capital Budget as presented at a previous Commissioners Public Meeting, and pointed out highlights of the budget. A copy of the full Budget is posted on the County's website and attached to and made a part of these Minutes by reference. Mr. Bennett again pointed out that the Budget is subject to changes subsequent to its adoption, because of the COVID-19 situation, and he walked through the Budget steps taken by the County this year.

Commissioner Shade thanked Mr. Bennett and his staff in the Finance Department. He also commented that the County is losing approximately \$200,000 in tax revenue per week as a result of COVID-19.

Upon Motion by Commissioner Caporale, seconded by Commissioner Brodie, and duly carried, the Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved and passed Resolution 20-5 adopting the Fiscal Year 2021 Operating and Capital Budget in the amount of \$141,815,560.

Item 4 – Motion to Adopt the Tax Levy & Differential – Authorize the Board of County Commissioners to adopt the Tax Levy & Differential and authorize the Collector of Public Assessments of Allegany County to demand and receive from the taxables the sums indicated therein – Jason M. Bennett, CPA, Director of Finance, explained that this Motion will authorize the County to issue tax bills. A copy of the Tax Levy and Differential is attached to and made a part of these Minutes.

Upon Motion by Commissioner Shade, seconded by Commissioner Brodie, and duly carried, the Board of County Commissioners unanimously adopted the Tax Levy & Differential and authorized the Collector of Public Assessments of Allegany County to demand and receive from the taxables the sums indicated therein.

Item 5 – Motion to Adopt the Supplemental Levy for Special Taxing Areas – Authorize the Board of County Commissioners to adopt the Supplemental Levy for Special Taxing Areas and authorize the Collector of Public Assessments to demand and receive from the taxpayers of the enumerated Special Taxing Areas those rates as listed as part of the Levy – Jason M. Bennett, CPA, Director of Finance. A copy of the Supplemental Levy for Special Taxing Areas is attached to and made a part of these Minutes.

Commissioner Brodie moved that the Board of County Commissioners adopt the Supplemental Levy for Special Taxing Areas and authorize the Collector of Public Assessments to demand and receive from the taxpayers of the enumerated Special Taxing Areas those rates as listed as part of the Levy. Commissioner Caporale seconded the Motion. Motion passed unanimously to adopt and authorize.

Item 6 – Motion to Approve and Adopt the Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years 2021 – 2025 – Authorize the Board of County Commissioners to approve and adopt the five-year Fiscal Year 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Program as presented at the May 7, 2020 public meeting – Daniel S. DeWitt, PE, County Engineer, asked the Commissioners to approve and adopt the CIP for Fiscal Years 2021-2025 as presented to the Board of County Commissioners at their public business meeting on May 7, 2020, subject to changes to be made later because of the COVID-19 situation. Mr. DeWitt reported that no public comments have been received since the May 7 presentation of the CIP.

Upon Motion made by Commissioner Caporale, and seconded by Commissioner Brodie, the Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved and adopted the five-year Fiscal Year 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Program as presented at the May 7, 2020 public meeting.

Item 7 – Motion Authorizing the Director of Finance to have the necessary Levy Documents published in the local newspaper and printed in the customary pamphlet form – Jason M. Bennett, CPA, Director of Finance.

Upon Motion made by Commissioner Caporale, seconded by Commissioner Brodie, and duly unanimously carried, the Board of County Commissioners authorized the Director of Finance to have the necessary Levy Documents published in the local newspaper and printed in the customary pamphlet form.

Item 8 – Fiscal Year 2021 Allegany County Sanitary Commission Recommendations – Board of County Commissioners to approve the water and sewer rates recommended by the Allegany County Sanitary Commission for Fiscal Year 2021, and adopt the rates as part of the Allegany County Fiscal Year 2021 budget – Adam Patterson, PE, Deputy Director of Public Works, reported that no public comments have been received regarding the water and sewer rates recommended by the Allegany County Sanitary Commission for Fiscal Year 2021, as previously presented.

Commissioner Brodie moved that the Board of County Commissioners approve the water and sewer rates recommended by the Allegany County Sanitary Commission for Fiscal Year 2021, and adopt the rates as part of the Allegany County Fiscal Year 2021 budget. Commissioner Caporale seconded the Motion. Motion carried unanimously to approve and adopt.

Following action on Items 3 through 8, Commissioner Shade announced that the County's Fiscal Year 2020-2021 has been officially adopted.

Item 9 – Approval for Appointment for Interim County Administrator – Board of County Commissioners to approve the appointment of Jason M. Bennett, CPA, as Interim County Administrator of Allegany County, Maryland – Jacob C. Shade, President, thanked outgoing County Administrator Brandon Butler for his service during his past two years as County Administrator, and then commented very favorably on the pending appointment of Jason Bennett as Interim County Administrator.

Upon Motion made by Commissioner Caporale, seconded by Commissioner Brodie, and duly carried, the Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved and appointed Jason M. Bennett, CPA, as Interim County Administrator for Allegany County.

Item 10 – Approval of Contract for the Allegany County Attorney – Board of County Commissioners to approve and sign the Employee Agreement for the appointment of T. Lee Beeman, Jr. as County Attorney of Allegany County, Maryland – Jacob C. Shade, President, asked the Board of County Commissioners for their approval of the Employment Agreement for the appointment of T. Lee Beeman, Jr., as County Attorney for Allegany County.

Upon Motion by Commissioner Brodie, seconded by Commissioner Caporale, and duly unanimously carried, the Board of County Commissioners approved and agreed to sign the Employee Agreement for the appointment of T. Lee Beeman, Jr. as County Attorney for Allegany County, Maryland.

Item 11 – Cancellation of the 2020 Allegany County Fair and Ag Expo – Board of County Commissioners to approve the necessary documentation to cancel the 2020 Allegany County Fair and Ag Expo due to the coronavirus pandemic – Jason M. Bennett, CPA, Director of Finance – Jacob C. Shade, President. Before presenting Item 11, Cancellation of the 2020 Allegany County Fair and Ag Expo, Mr. Bennett thanked the County Commissioners for their faith in him and for appointing him as Interim County Administrator. He also thanked Mr. Butler for his service as County Administrator. Mr. Bennett remarked on his great staff, as well as the County's great Management Team, and said they will be very helpful to him as he takes on his new responsibilities as Interim Administrator.

Mr. Bennett announced that the 2020 Allegany County Fair and Ag Expo needs to be cancelled. He explained that on May 14, 2020, the County's 4-H activities were suspended through August 1, 2020; that Reithoffer Shows Inc., which provides the rides at the annual Fair, is still in Florida and unable to travel; and that mass gatherings are still not permitted in Maryland because of the COVID-19 virus. Mr. Bennett pointed out that the cancellation of the Fair is necessary at this time so that the entertainment contracts can be cancelled. He told the Commissioners that the entertainment acts have verbally agreed to come to the Fair next year instead, and added that anyone who has already purchased tickets to any of the performances can either receive a refund or have the payment applied to tickets for next year.

Commissioners Shade and Brodie both commented that the Commissioners have no choice regarding cancelling this year's Fair, as the State mandates in place prevent going forward with it.

Upon Motion made by Commissioner Caporale, seconded by Commissioner Brodie, and duly carried, the Board of County Commissioners approved the necessary documentation to cancel the 2020 Allegany County Fair and Ag Expo due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19).

CONSENT AGENDA

Upon Motion by Commissioner Brodie, seconded by Commissioner Caporale, and Motion carried, the Board of County Commissioners adopted the Consent Agenda as recommended by the Interim County Administrator.

Item 12 – Potomac Highlands Airport Authority Re-Appointment – Board of County Commissioners re-appointed David Weimer to the Potomac Highlands Airport Authority. His term will expire on June 30, 2023.

Item 13 – 2020 to 2023 Memorandum of Understanding for Section 8 Housing and Rehabilitation – Board of County Commissioners authorized the President of the Board of County Commissioners to sign the MOU for Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher and the Section 8 Moderate Rehabilitation; and also to sign the sub-recipient agreements with HRDC for their continued administration of both programs through June 30, 2023.

Item 14 – American Fidelity Assurance Company Benefit Proposal – Board of County Commissioners approved the proposal from American Fidelity Assurance Company to implement an online benefits enrollment platform including employee communication and education, maintenance of Section 125 Plan, and various supplemental benefit offerings.

Item 15 – 2020 Emergency Management Performance Grant Acceptance – Board of County Commissioners authorized the acceptance of the 2020 Emergency Management Performance Grant in the amount of \$82,912.85 for reimbursement of Emergency Management program costs.

Item 16 – 2020 Emergency Management Performance Grant COVID-19 Supplemental Program Acceptance – Board of County Commissioners authorized the acceptance of the 2020 Emergency Management Performance Grant COVID-19 Supplemental Grant in the amount of \$47,301.80 with up to \$23,650.90 for reimbursement of COVID-19 costs as outlined by FEMA.

Item 17 – New Dump Trucks for Department of Public Works Roads Division Bid Award – Board of County Commissioners awarded the purchase of three new dump trucks to Freightliner of Hagerstown, Hagerstown, Maryland, in the amount of \$392,292.

Item 18 – New Pickup Truck for Public Works Maintenance Department – Board of County Commissioners approved the purchase of one new Ford F250 pickup truck with plow and liftgate to Apple Ford Lincoln, in the amount of \$34,900.

Item 19 – Engineering Services for Variable Volume & Temperature (VVT) System Replacement at the Brook Building – Board of County Commissioners approved the award of an Engineering Services Contract to East Hills Engineering Associates, Windber, Pennsylvania, for the VVT system replacement at the Allegany County Health Department Brook Building, in the amount of \$8,350.

Item 20 – Bridges A-015, A-016, and A-018 Replacement Project – Laurel Run Road Contract No.: AC-20-BR-01 Bid Award – Board of County Commissioners authorized the Department of Public Works to award Contract AC-20-BR-01: Replacement of Bridges A-015, A-016, and A-018 – Laurelwood Run Road to the lowest responsible bidder, and authorized the President of the County Commissioners to sign necessary award documents and agreements to proceed to construction.

Item 21 – Request for Tax Abatement – Board of County Commissioners authorized the abatement of taxes in the amount of \$3,240.82. This request is for tax years 2015 to 2020 and will assist Archway Station, Inc., in acquiring and tearing down an abandoned property adjacent to their property.

Interim County Administrator Jason M. Bennett had no further comments to make at this evening's meeting.

County Attorney T. Lee Beeman, Jr. thanked the Commissioners for approving his contract and appointing him officially as County Attorney.

Commissioners' statements, comments, recognition –

Commissioner David J. Caporale remarked that he looked forward to the next phase of reopening the State of Maryland.

Commissioner Creade V. Brodie, Jr. said that he hoped everyone had a good Memorial Day holiday. He also acknowledged Captain Dan Lasher, present at this evening's meeting, and then congratulated new County Attorney Lee Beeman and Interim County Administrator Jason Bennett. Commissioner Brodie expressed his thanks to Mr. Brandon Butler and wished him luck in his next endeavor.

Commissioner Jacob C. Shade reported that the COVID-19 grant fund is a success, and that the funds should be out the door next week, for a total of \$800,000 total in funding. Commissioner Shade said that funding is still available, and that the application process has been designed to be as simple as possible.

Fiscal Year 2021 Budget Message

May 28, 2020

Dear Allegany County Residents:

The Fiscal Year 2021 budget recognizes the local and national realities we are facing due to the downturn of our economy, while positioning local government to rebound past the global pandemic.

In April, 2019, our community was met with the shock of the announced closure of the Luke paper mill. This 131-year institution provided generations of Allegany County residents with a source of good wages. It was also a part of the fabric of many of our communities along George's Creek. This loss to our community is still being felt. Due to the continued fiscal restraint shown by the Board of County Commissioners in previous budgets, our FY 2021 budget includes no tax increases despite these losses.

Our outside partner agencies have continued to creatively fund their priorities and operations, even as funding from the County continues to remain flat. We wanted to thank Allegany College of Maryland, Allegany County Public Schools, Allegany County Health Department, and the Allegany County Library System for their continued partnership.

While continuing to restrain the growth of government, Allegany County has been successful in exploring and obtaining new opportunities. Working with our state and federal partners, we were very successful in obtaining state capital budget funding for vitally important economic development projects, and federal and state grants for both capital and operational costs. This demonstrates the County's continued willingness to move forward toward economic sustainability and growth.

The FY 2021 budget continues to fund emergency management at historic levels, continues to invest in education, and further invests in our public infrastructure. As we move forward out of the economic havoc caused by the COVID-19, the strong partnerships forged between the County, our local agencies, state, and federal partners will be that much more important.

Real Property

The State Tax Rate has been fixed by the Board of Public Works of the State of Maryland at 11.2 cents (\$0.1120) per \$100 of assessable real property subject to such tax which added to the non-city tax rate of \$0.9750 dollars (\$0.9750) makes a total of \$1.0870 on each \$100 of assessable non-city property subject to such tax.

Personal Property

The State Tax Rate has been fixed by the Board of Public Works of the State of Maryland at 0.0 cents (\$0.00) per \$100 of assessable personal property subject to such tax which added to the non-city tax rate of \$2.4375 dollars (\$2.4375) makes a total of \$2.4375 on each \$100 of assessable non-city property subject to such tax.

Public Utilities

The State Tax Rate has been fixed by the Board Of Public Works of the State of Maryland at 0.28 cents (\$0.2800) of assessed value of the property of public utilities subject to such tax which added to the non-city tax rate of \$2.4375 dollars (\$2.4375) makes a total of \$2.7175 on each \$100 of assessed value of property of public utilities non-city property subject to such tax.

In compliance with the provisions of Section 6-302 and 6-305 of the Tax Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the following tax rates will be levied in the municipalities in Allegany County:

The Board of County Commissioners is, by authority of Section 10-301 of the Tax Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, establishing a discount rate as follows: One percent (1%) shall be deducted from real property tax bills for County purposes which are paid in a full annual payment during the months of July and August. No discount will be provided on such tax bills during the month of September nor will any discounts be allowed on any other payments including personal property. Interest at the rate of one and one-half percent (1 ½%) per month, or fractional part thereof, shall be charged from the first day of October on full-year property and after thirty (30) days on half-year new construction property as allowed by Section 14-603 and Section 14-604 of the Tax Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland. On owner occupied residential real property, interest of one and one-half percent (1 ½%) per month shall be charged from October 1st on coupon number one (1) and January 1st for coupon number two (2). Furthermore the rate of redemption is eighteen percent (18%) per annum as allowed by Section 14-820 of the Tax Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

State Of Maryland

Allegany County, To-Wit:

Chapter 261 of the Acts of 1918 of the Public General Laws of Maryland, provided that no discount will be allowed on State taxes. Interest at the rate of one percent (1%) per month will be collected from October 1st.

The Collector of Public Assessments of Allegany County, Maryland for the year July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 is hereby authorized and empowered to demand and receive from the non-city taxables of Allegany County the sum of \$1.087 dollars (\$1.087) on real property, the sum of \$2.4375 dollars (\$2.4375) on personal property, and the sum of \$2.7175 dollars (\$2.7175) on public utilities for One Hundred Dollars assessable non-city property subject to such tax, and the sums set forth herein for all assessable property located in each of the municipalities in said County and State, including State Tax rate as fixed by the Board of Public Works, agreeable to the Public General Laws of Maryland, in relation to collection of taxes on said assessments in Allegany County, Maryland.
